

The Ultimate Safe Assembly Guide for Every Room

A printable room-by-room safety guide to prevent furniture failures.

1. THE BEDROOM (TALL WARDROBES & DRESSERS)

- ☐ **Account for Tight Vertical Assembly Clearance**
When ceiling heights are extremely tight, tall wardrobes cannot be safely built face-down and tilted up. Construct the entire unit vertically from the ground up to protect joints from shearing stress.
- ☐ **Compensate for Uneven Floors**
Find the floor baseline high point with a spirit level before anchoring. Adjust front threaded feet shims immediately so frame weight settles cleanly backward, never leaning forward.

2. LIVING & DINING AREA (BOOKCASES & MEDIA UNITS)

- ☐ **Match Fasteners to Wall Type Substrates**
Never use plastic wall plugs in hollow drywall. Always upgrade to metal toggle bolts for plasterboard, or expansion anchors for solid masonry and brickwork.
- ☐ **Audit Joint Cam-Locks and Load Balances**
Inspect all locking mechanisms and turn cam-locks completely to eliminate structural sway. Store heavy books and items exclusively on the bottom tiers to lower the unit's center of gravity.

3. KIDS' ROOMS & NURSERIES (TOY CHESTS & DRAWERS)

- ☐ **Mandatory Anti-Tip Hardware Anchoring**
All child-accessible furniture items over 75cm tall strictly require anti-tip safety straps or metal wall brackets fixed into solid timber wall studs.
- ☐ **Test Drawer Interlock Behaviors**
Ensure drawer glides move uniformly. Practice household rules prohibiting children from opening multiple drawers at once, which alters forward torque and hazards tip-overs.

4. HOME OFFICE & STUDY (DESKS & OFFICE SHELVING)

- ☐ **Scan for Hidden Cable and Pipe Grids**
Always map behind walls with an multi-detector before drilling any brackets to prevent severe utility punctures into live electrical wiring or behind-wall plumbing.
- ☐ **Verify Absolute Frame Squareness**
Measure corners diagonally from side to side before securing backboard sheets. An unsquared frame deforms over time, leading to hinge twisting and door alignment failure.

Furniture structural failures are completely preventable. Never rely purely on item mass or carpet settling for stability. Always perform a rigorous lateral force push test on every newly anchored unit to ensure zero sway before storing items.
